



**Mt Tabor Yard - Parks Replacement Bond – Comment Form Summary
Open House – October 8, 2016**

An open house for the Mt Tabor Yard Bond Project was held on Saturday, October 8, 2016 from 10am – 12pm at Mt Tabor Yard. Outreach included posts on project website and Parks online calendar, yard signs throughout Mt Tabor Park, flyers distributed to nearby park neighbors, an ad in the SE Examiner October edition, posts on Mt Tabor-related Facebook pages, and two rounds of emails to interested parties. A paper comment form was provided at the Open House, and a similar version was posted online for two weeks after the Open House, along with the Open House presentation materials. A total of 50 comments were received.

The goal of the Open House was to share information about the new maintenance building and bike/pedestrian path, provide tours of the current Yard layout, and get community feedback. Boards were posted displaying this information, and Yard and project staff were on hand to provide tours for visitors and answer questions.

It should be noted that this report reflects the opinions of those who chose to participate. It cannot be considered a statistically correct survey and is not necessarily representative of the broader community. This information, in addition to information provided by the Mt Tabor Yard Planning Group, Parks staff, and other stakeholders will be used to inform the final design for the Mt Tabor Yard new maintenance building and pathway.

1. As we consider a new greenhouse location, please rank the following (1= Most important, 5= Least important):

- 1) Maintain park access 4.39 (**Most important**)
- 2) Tree preservation 3.61
- 3) Other 3.5
- 4) An attractive feature 3.2
- 5) Minimize footprint 2.72 (**Least important**)

- 5) Increased noise 2.53 **(Least important)**
